**NEXT MEETING MONDAY, APRIL 10, 2023** 

Spring has sprung here in Palm Beach County. How nice it has been to have several days of long-awaited rainfall. We can water till the cows come home but there's nothing like a good downpour to brighten up our gardens.

Calling all begonia collectors...accomplished Florida begonia grower and expert Doug Pridgen has contacted our society with a request. He has been searching for B. 'Amber Sweet', a cane begonia that was hybridized by Greg Sytch. He hasn't been able to find the plant and Greg Sytch advised he no longer has it. He doesn't want to see the Amber Sweet hybrid lost to the ages. Does anyone have it in their collection? If so, please contact us so that we can figure out a way to get either a plant or at least a cutting to Mr. Pridgen.

We had a spirited mini auction during our February meeting, led by auctioneer Lois Petzold. Lois auctioned off numerous beautiful hybrid and species begonias. These mini auctions are loads of fun with the added bonus of adding to our coffers which allows us to the ability to continue bringing interesting, sometimes hard to find, begonias to our group for purchase. We are thankful to Lois for taking up the mantle as our auctioneer.

We were pleased to have Horticulturist Palmer Crippen join us and present his program, Epiphytic Ant Plants of the South Pacific, for our March meeting. He took us on a pictorial tour through the rain forest of the South Pacific so that we could observe the incredibly unique and bizarre world epiphytic ant plants. Palmer's program was informative and educational, with a discussion on the wide diversity of these living, symbiotic ant homes, together with their native habitats and

cultivation. He shared photos of some of the most rarely seen and elusive plants in the wild. Not only did Palmer put on a great program for us, he also has been very supportive of our group by visiting our meeting and also helping out with our groom the begonia garden day at the Mounts Botanical Garden.

Ant Plant – Hoya imbricata

We had a fantastic garden tour day on March 18<sup>th</sup>. Two of our members, Frances Drescher and Pauline Ma, both live in the same neighborhood and both have beautiful gardens.

We met at Frances' home first where we were able to enjoy countless species and hybrid begonias both potted on her screened patio or planted in the landscape. Frances enjoys adding unusual and hard to find plants and trees to her yard. Her screened in patio is home to stunning potted begonias many of which were in bloom. There are also many other shade loving plants growing beautifully – hanging pots of hoya, an unusual sansevieria, ferns, bromeliads, Zamioculcas zamfolia "ZZ plant" and succulents. She also is growing begonias in terrariums. She has numerous terrariums in varying shapes and sizes beautifully displayed in her home where they receive the perfect amount of light. She is also propagating many plants. Frances' backyard is a serene and peaceful space with meandering pathways shaded by, to name a couple, Japanese Fern trees and a unique Silk Floss tree. She has lots of begonias planted in the ground, different varieties of variegated hoya vining up and hanging from trees, pink princess philodendron vining up trees with it's lovely pink and dark green leaves, lots of butterfly attractors including a white shrimp plant with pretty white/lavender blooms. There is also a stand of rhizomatous begonias growing beautifully in a rock garden. It would be impossible to list all the plants in her garden, but suffice to say you cannot

take a step without seeing something to beautiful to behold, whether you are looking on the ground, straight ahead or up into the trees.

Next, we traveled a short distance to Pauline's home. Pauline and her husband are true collectors – specifically orchids, begonias, hoyas and succulents, just to name a few. They have extensive plant racks filled to overflowing with orchids outside and inside their screened porch and a standalone screened shade house with more orchids, hoyas, begonias and succulents. We were there at the perfect time for the orchids, as many of these were stunningly in bloom. Pauline's screened shade house is bordered by a beautifully designed, meditative Zen-like rock covered space with statuary, container gardens and a vine covered trellis. Once inside the shade house you find Pauline's various collections of begonias, succulents and other plants on the right, and her husband's expansive collection of orchids on the left. We had a grand time soaking in all that beauty. Outside in the yard are lots of palms underplanted with unusual tropicals and of course, more succulents. She has a beautiful potted rock fig nestled in one of the planted areas.

Both Frances and Pauline pride themselves on their thoughtful placement of plants in the landscape together with potted specimens, garden statuary and perfectly placed rocks. It was such a pleasure to see the joy on each of their faces as they exhibited their well cared for and beautifully designed garden spaces.


